In the campus garden, surrounded by flowers, students run a café in a renovated greenhouse. With its attractive location in the middle of Denmark's capital, this makes LIFE an oasis for students and employees and contributes to making LIFE an attractive and inspiring place to study and to work. LIFE also has a campus in Taastrup, just outside Copenhagen. The facilities include a new, unique university hospital for large animals which has been built on the basis of the latest knowledge about the welfare and well-being of animals.

Each year, LIFE welcomes more than 400 international students from all over the world. More than 20 per cent of our Danish students go abroad to study, thereby gaining invaluable language and intercultural competences. More than 10 per cent of LIFE's researchers and several of our study programmes focus on development issues.

### International career prospects in a vibrant international study environment

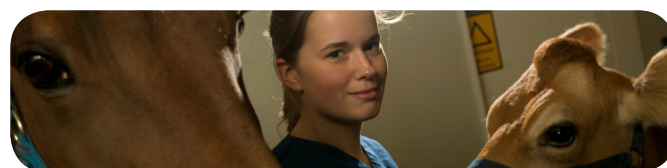
